DNA Technology and Ecology Trip - July 2023

This year has been unusual in that we have run two DNA tech trips, one in April (due to Covid postponement), and now a second in July. The courses were run at the Life Science Lab at Castle Head Field Studies Centre in Grange-Over-Sands, Cumbria.

On both occasions, the students had a wonderful immersive experience in the molecular biology lab and learnt how to culture bacteria, extract and purify DNA, use DNA restriction enzymes and run gel electrophoresis. The contexts in which they developed their new skills were:- breast cancer screening (for BRCA-1), a forensics problem to solve, and identifying genetically transformed bacterial containing the human insulin gene. They also learnt some great bush-craft skills, small mammal population sampling methods (direct and indirect sampling), and they investigated plant communities on the sand dunes at Hawes Head near Barrow in Furness. They really flourished and learnt lots of new and exciting things that they can apply to their A Level Biology course and will also be brilliant for their UCAS applications next year. All in all, a fab trip and the students were outstanding.

2023 Sports Day Report

On Friday 7th July students in years seven to ten competed in our annual AGS sports day. In glorious sunshine everyone gathered on the field, many painted in their house colours, creating an exciting, festival atmosphere.

It was a record breaking day, with the lead changing hands several times throughout the day, with Newport ultimately coming out on top. There were 14 individual records broken along the way, one of which had stood for 13 years until now. The standard of performance was so high that two records were broken twice in the same day!

On the track, the following records were broken, including the highly competitive 1500m races where two athletes beat the previous bests in both the year seven girls and year eight open events:

- **300M Yr7 Open** Kian Plandano previous record 48.3 new record 47.9
- **300m Yr9 Girls** Connie Gregory previous record 50.5 new record 49.8
- **1500m Yr 7 Girls** Holly Hanson previous 6.17.1 new record 5.52.2 (Imogen Wynne also broke the record with 6.05.3 but did not set)
- **1500M Yr8 Open** Joel Ledgard previous record 5.05.0 new record 5.02.9 (Aran Cooper also broke the record with 5.04.0 but did not set)
- **1500m Yr9 Open** Thomas Fisher drew with current record 5.48.0
- **1500m Yr 10 Girls** Holly Saunders previous 5.39.0 new record 5.37.5

Whilst in the field, the bar was set just as high, with these new records set:

- **Long Jump Yr7 Girls** Ellie Watson previous 3.63m new record 3.69m
- **Long Jump Yr9 Open** Michael Campbell previous record 4.56m new record 5.46m
- **Discus Yr9 Open** Samuel Lock previous record 21.78m new record 22.75m
- **Javelin Yr9 Open** Louie Newton previous record 32.40m new record 34.38m
- **Shot Yr9 Girls** Ava Clive previous record 7.49m new record 7.55m
- **Shot Yr10 Girls** Nikola Woodzisz previous record 8.76m new record 9.80m

The House competition itself was hotly contested. At the half-way stage, it was announced that Dobell had the lead, but everything changed later on, as Newport went on to win, with Dobell second, and Wells third.

Looking at the final breakdown of points, Dobell actually won the girls competition, ahead of Newport and Spencer. Newport took the open competition, with Wells second and Dobell third. Spencer will hope to bounce back from their 4th place finish next year.

Many congratulations to Newport, the House Champions, to all our individual record-breakers and to everyone who competed and made the day so enjoyable. Thanks to our staff and all who worked behind the scenes to ensure everything ran so smoothly. We look forward to doing it all again next year!

Exams Update

Well done to all of our pupils who have completed their exams. All pupils were punctual, followed the rules and respectful. In total 7,453 AS, A level and GCSE exams were taken. We sent off 285 parcels to be marked and on average ran 14 rooms a day in May and 9 rooms a day in June. We are now looking forward to the results days!

AS and A level results are released at 8am on Thursday 17 August and GCSE results are released at 8am on Thursday 24th August. Pupils access their results via their AGS portal.
