



Launch of New House System

Mobile Devices

Update from Mrs Shipway

This term has seen the introduction of our new and updated [AGS mobile devices policy](#). As I am sure most of you are aware, in February of this year, the Department for Education introduced new guidance for schools on prohibiting the use of mobile phones throughout the school day. Gillian Keegan (Secretary of State for Education) summed it up this way; “Children are growing up in an increasingly complex world, living their lives on and offline. This presents many exciting opportunities – but also challenges. By prohibiting mobile phones, schools can create safe and calm environments free from distraction so all pupils can receive the education they deserve.”

While the decision to prohibit the use of mobile phones throughout the school day is one that has come directly from the Government, the rationale behind this is something we fully support at AGS. It is evident that mobile phones do risk unnecessary distraction and disruption, can limit social interaction, and increase risks associated with social media and cyber-bullying, not to mention the peer pressure and possible stigma associated with owning what are often expensive devices, and anxiety about digital images being captured without consent.

We anticipate the benefits of this change will be huge and long-lasting. Without the use of mobile phones, a school culture can change for the better. The environment becomes safer, protecting pupils not only from the distraction and background noise of notifications and their lives outside school but from the pressure to be constantly on social media. Pupils have the headspace and calm to focus on their lessons and time to develop the important social interactions and communication skills that are essential for life.

We are delighted to see how well our students have embraced this change. The majority of our students fully understand the reasons behind this decision, and have embraced the opportunity to increase social interaction. Staff have noted an increase in verbal and social communications, and have been pleasantly surprised by the engagement of the vast majority. It is a delight to walk around at break and lunch and see students playing card games, a variety of ball games, utilising the table tennis or chess sets, and reading books.

I would like to thank you for your support of school in this matter, and have enjoyed the supportive feedback a large number of parents have provided regarding this change.


Students will be receiving advice on revision skills over the next few weeks through the tutor programme and/or Friday morning Life programme.

All the revision skills materials are available on the AGS Intranet (Study Skills \ Revision) and can be accessed using the student's login.



For each year group, this includes the following:

- A revision shopping list
- An electronic revision planner template
- Active revision strategies
- how to store knowledge in the long term memory
- how to retrieve knowledge



Year 7-10 Revision Guidance

How you can support your child with revision:

1. **Revision timetable** – work together on creating this. Colour code, highlight and tick off what has been achieved. Timetable in treats and breaks.
2. **Space** – Consider which area of the house will be best. Somewhere quiet with natural light and no distractions if at all possible
3. **Materials** – Check your child has all the necessary stationery and highlighters etc.
4. **Varied revision methods** – Use whatever works for them; post its, video clips, mind maps or other ideas.
5. **Take a break** – Plenty of sleep, exercise and breaks are also needed.
6. **Bite-size chunks** – It's easy to overestimate what can be achieved, especially with a limited concentration span. Use a timer to know when to have a break. Try the Pomodoro technique?
7. **Stress and worry** – Help your child re-plan their time to include relaxation techniques.
8. **Apps and online help** – Mix it up with engaging interactive activities, without too much screen time!
9. **Be on hand** – Be available where possible and interested in their revision. On the other hand, allow them space to learn to work (and relax) independently.
10. **Food** – Keep those treats close by, including healthy brain food!
11. **Check the revision guidance** – ensure they haven't missed out on anything crucial.
12. **Ask for help** – If there are any concepts that are confusing, encourage them to ask teachers for help
13. **Study friends** – Revising with a friend can make it more fun. As long as that is what they are doing!
14. **Build confidence** – Keep encouraging and motivating. Remind them that you are proud of their efforts and whatever the outcome, they will still be awesome.
15. **Focus** – finally, turn off background music and notifications, whatever your child says, it does not help!

All the best to all our students in their exams, and thank you to parents for your support.

South Africa 2024

Exams Update

Good luck to pupils who will be taking their MFL speaking exams. Please arrive at least five minutes before your scheduled time.

Year 11 to 13 should check their timetable on their AGS portal. The rooming has now been finalised so please check you have a room and seat number for every exam.

Year 11 - For History and RE there is more than one paper on the timetable but only one with a duration. This is because the paper covers more than one topic and pupils answer the relevant questions. The exam with a duration will show a room and seat no and the other papers won't. Some subjects will have TBA, this will probably be for the modern foreign languages speaking tests and art. Dates for these will be communicated via their teacher.

JCQ have designated the afternoons of Thursday 6 June and Thursday 13 June and the morning and afternoon of Wednesday 26 June as contingency sessions for examinations. All pupils must be available on these dates so that if exams cannot take place due to widespread, sustained national or local disruption in the UK they can be rescheduled.


